the celebration of our Lord’s death
and resurrection. Today we come
together to begin this solemn
celebration in union with the Church
throughout the world. Christ enters

his own city to complete his work as our Saviour, to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us go with him in faith and love, so that, united with him in his sufferings, we may share his risen life.

The people hold up palms or branches while this prayer is said by the president

God our Saviour,
whose Son Jesus Christ entered
Jerusalem as Messiah to suffer and to die;
let these palms be for us signs of his
victory
and grant that we who bear them in
his name
may ever hail him as our King,
and follow him in the way that leads
to eternal life;
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.
